DELLA MORTIKA Steampunk Adventures

LOGLINE: This is the fantastical city of Della Mortika, where steam is king, where life is hard, but where adventure is always adventure.

BRIEF SYNOPSIS: Set inside a pop-up book are the stories of Della Mortika, a melting-pot of characters. We meet three English sisters who are searching for their missing parents, a Russian soldier trying to make his mark on the world, an Irish scamp just getting by, an Aboriginal boy wanting to become a great inventor and an Evil Baron intent on controlling the city. Their paths cross, their lives intermingle, their fates are intwined.

FORMAT: Della Mortika is a paper stop-motion animation of 13 x 12 min episodes (currently developed). It would lend itself to more episodes of either 12 or 26 mins.

DEMOGRAPHIC: Ages 8-12 years. Will appeal to boys, girls and their parents.



ABIGAIL

ABIGAIL is the eldest of the three Della Morte sisters. At 17, she's had to grow up fast in the absence of her parents and take on more responsibility for her sisters than she'd like.

Some days she resents them, other days they drive her crazy, but most days she loves them.

Abigail is cautious and conservative, bossy and idealistic - just like big sisters are and always will be.

MRS CROTCHET -SMYTHE MRS CROTCHET SMYTHE

is the angry Scottish woman who runs the Skipping Girl Orphanage for Wayward and Homeless Girls, where the Della Morte Sisters live. She does so with an iron fist, a brass tongue, and a crossbow of rubber balls.

She notices that the Sisters are strongest when together so is constantly trying to break them up. She has also noticed the Baron's interest in them...and oh how she loves a Baron...

PARAH

ZARAH is the youngest Della Morte and is never allowed to forget it. Despite being the 'little one', she is practical, headstrong and impatient.

She's the tom-boy of the sisters, forever climbing machines and pulling toys apart to see how they work.

She is courageous and intelligent, resourceful and energetic.

Charlie Buttons is a curious and clever ten year old rascal, an indigenous boy from 'The Snowy' in Ngunnawal country. He boarded a steam train to Melbourne at the age of seven to see what delights the big city held, always planning to return to his family with tall stories and piles of copper.

In bondage to a scrap metal merchant, who found him sleeping in a shed. Charlie works hard but often takes off for more exciting adventures when the mood takes him., which is where he encountered his now best friend Zarah. They share a love of mechanical things, a desire to figure them out and a cleverness used for cunning!

Charlie and Zarah find each other when times are tough and troubles abound for two children in a harsh and unfamiliar city.



THE EPISODES

1. The Shipwreck of Sorrows

The Della Morte sisters are shipwrecked and placed in the Skipping Girl Home for Wayward and Homeless Girls.

2. The Library of Wonder

The evil Professor Malefic imprisons children in order to exploit their young and vivid imaginations in his glorious Library of Wonder.

3. The Carnivale of Calumny

Pasha rescues the Great Gazali, who then provides a clue for his quest using his fortune telling machine, a Babbage-inspired probability-calculating computer.

4. The Asylum of Despair

The evil Dr Hippocampus attempts to capture Mitchell and subject him to his brain-control machine.

5. The Steam Powered Man

Abigail encounters a steam powered man with an interesting story to tell about a man interested in artificial intelligence and armies of robots.



6. The Emporium of Avarice

The Widow Dolarchevsky spins a web of deceit as she operates the Emporium of Avarice. She she sits in a glass booth overlooking her huge store and accumulates money and gold through her hydraulic cashier system, which on the surface looks legal enough.

7. The Shriving Wall of Secrets

The Whisper Catcher, a Rumorologist, operates the Shriving Wall of Secrets - the place people relieve themselves cathartically of their hidden truths. However, he uses what he hears for his own and his master's benefit.

8. The Garden of Broken Dreams

The Curator of the Garden of Broken Dreams catches broken dreams and takes them to his garden conservatory where they wander aimlessly.

9. The Carousel of Shame

The Constabulary operate a Carousel of Shame where they imprison citizens who perpetrate petty crimes.

10. The House of Pestilence

Dr Contagion is Superintendent of the House of Pestilence and attempts to subject Charlie Buttons to his Miasma Extraction Machine which will render them senseless.





11. The Locomotive of Malevolence

Engineer Oliver Coalbuster drives the Dandenong Dasher which tends to take passengers off the beaten track.

12. The Vale of Tears

Black enshrouded widows are grieving so much that they are unable to do anything for themselves. They are starving to death in a valley they are lured to by an evil Baroness who steals all their possessions.

13. The Astounding Astrolabe

The Astounding Astrolabe allows the Della Morte sisters to travel through time and space to rescue their parents from the Evil Baron.



The style of animation is paper-cut outs, shot in a three-dimensional set in a stop-motion fashion, with some composited elements. The adventures of the three girls is contained in a large, old book. The film begins with the unlocking and opening of that book,

a pop-up book containing the world of Della Mortika. In stop-motion, the pop up book will open and the buildings will rise from the pages. This will happen with the transition from scene to scene - the silhouettes of the Victorian Steampunk world,

the beautiful Della Morte sisters, the handsome soldiers, the story-book story-telling and the dark world create a new and beautiful visual experience.





THE WORLD

The world of Della Mortika incorporates paper engineering with puppets and pop-ups in a steampunk stop-motion animated tv series show-casing the adventures of the characters in a dark, dangerous, elegant and exciting world.



An alternate Melbourne of the 1800s provides the backdrop for the story. Magnificent Victorian public buildings, dark and dirty laneways and extraordinary transport systems are a fitting milieu for the adventures of the young girls. The world is filled with amazing machines including cable cars and steam locomotives, mechanical and spring-loaded cashier systems, hybrid wind and steam-powered flying machines, gas lighting and the ever-present coal-burning power station continuously spewing out its foul smelling smoke, enveloping the city in a putrid cloud.

Melbourne steampunk society provides a slippery structure for the young characters to navigate. For the Della Morte Sisters, their background is privileged, their current circumstances harsh and poverty stricken. For Pasha Dimitrikov, he feels he has something to prove, for the Baron von Barbicon, he must walk the line between political diplomacy and his evil, malevolent dreams for the city. In this world invention and innovation are highly valued and wealth measured in patents and intellectual property is coveted and tightly guarded.

Steampunk Della Mortika is a town out of time. The normal line of history is altered in this world making it appear archaic and advanced, Dickensian and Orwellian, elegant and spooky.

The tone of the series is excitement in the midst of danger, with villianous intrigue offset by comedic moments and romance.
